Thank you so much for your interest in the second Home Visiting Action Network meeting!

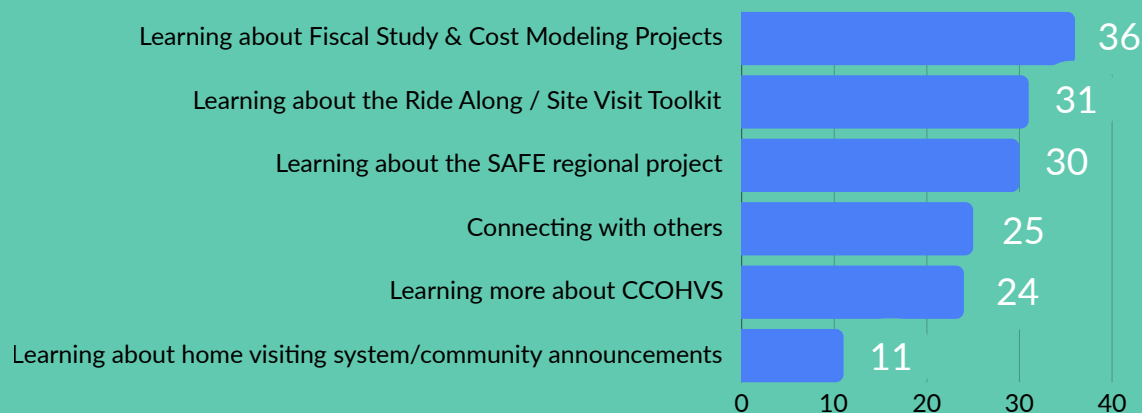
Once again, nearly 100 participants joined us for this effort to expand access and engagement in emerging Home Visiting Systems Transformation work!

This meeting focused on fiscal and funding projects including a statewide home visiting fiscal study, home visiting service and system cost modeling projects, an exploration of more collaborative home visiting funding processes at the state level, and project SAFE - a regional effort to improve home visiting funding access and equity.

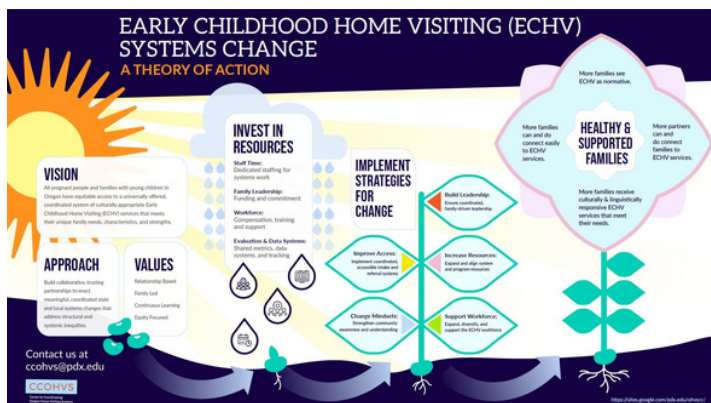
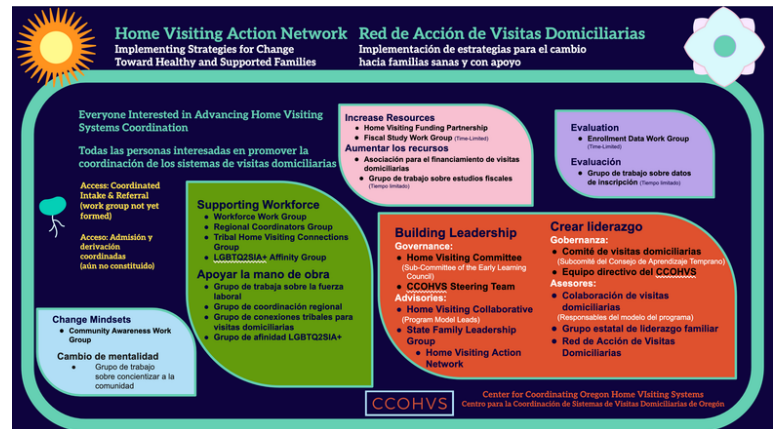

The Home Visiting Action Network is aligned to the Oregon Home Visiting Systems Theory of Action (TOA), which is aligned to the Early Learning Council's Raise Up Oregon 2.0 and is being established with the purpose of connection and implementation of the TOA strategies.



Home Visiting Action Network Meetings occur three times per year utilizing the C.A.L.M. meeting model (Connect, Align, Learn, Make). The next meeting will take place in July (keep an eye out for a scheduling poll). Participants agree to meeting norms and to utilize an equity lens in decision making.

For the purposes of the Home Visiting Action Network, home visiting includes prenatal to five optional preventive home visiting services supporting children and families.

Increasing Resources

Fiscal Study and Cost Modeling Projects

At the request of the Home Visiting Committee (a standing sub-committee of the Early Learning Council), CCOHVS launched a Fiscal Study Work Group early in 2025, which selected Prenatal to Five Fiscal Strategies as the contractor for a statewide home visiting fiscal study and, subsequently, service and system cost modeling projects. Reports from those projects are coming soon.

A few questions about the process emerged during the March HVAN meeting:

Question: *Would this include home visiting for families who are working as well, such as those whose babies may be in child care or center based care as well as receiving home visiting services through say Nurse Family Partnership?*

Answer: The cost tool includes modeling for home visiting programs that have center- and home-based components. However, the cost model only accounts for the costs to administer the home-based components of those programs.

Question: *Is Early Intervention going to be included in the cost model?*

Answer: Early Intervention is not included in the cost model at this time, due to the specific flow of those dollars and the directive that all children must be served if eligible and families choose to enroll.

Question: *Is the tool tracking/comparing based on type of Home Visitor? I.e., an Registered Nurse versus an Family Support Specialist?*

Answer: Yes. Models for different programs have accounted for different salary ranges based on type of home visitor.

Question: *It sounds like the resources needed/costs for state-level (like CCOHVS) system work will be factored into the tool(s)...will regional home visitation coordination be included in these cost models, too?*

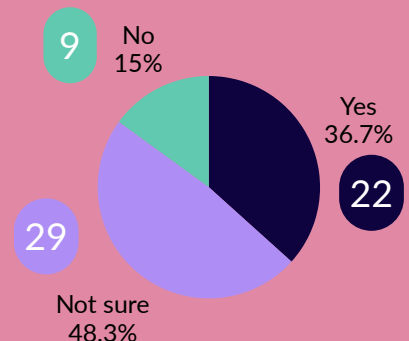
Answer: Yes definitely. That is a key piece of the system model. Great question!

Home Visiting Funding Partnership

The Home Visiting Funding Partnership (HVFP) has been working on strategies for Cultivating Home Visiting Champions to ensure that legislatures and other decision makers in the state have clear understanding of the value and effectiveness of home visiting. As the short session recently ended, we have multiple ride along and site visit opportunities planned so that people can learn about home visiting by experiencing it. In partnership with Prevent Child Abuse Oregon, Stately Pine Consulting, and CCOHVS, an Early Childhood Home Visiting Site Visit and Ride Along Toolkit was developed in English and Spanish so that regional partners can invite prioritized representatives in their areas to experience and better understand home visiting. At the 2025 home visiting summit, the HVFP prioritized exploring opportunities for collaborative home visiting funding at the state level. Consultants Judy Reidt-Parker and Megan Turner from Start Early have been supporting that effort and developed a 3-page information brief about key considerations for state funding coordination, which you can find in the meeting resources [folder](#).

Increase Awareness

A new work group launched in March to advance the strategy of Changing Mindsets about Home Visiting by Building Community Awareness!

The group participants hope to collaborate to demystify, simplify information and combat stigma and fear about home visiting.

Priorities from the Fall 2025 Home Visiting Summit for this work include:

- Developing a family-informed state and regional community education / awareness raising plan
- Compiling a centralized resource of educational materials to develop shared messaging and communication in multiple formats and languages
