Home Visiting Action Network Meetings will occur three times per year (twice virtually, once in person) utilizing the C.A.L.M. meeting model (Connect, Align, Learn, Make). The next meeting will take place in March (please complete this scheduling poll by December 5th). Participants agree to meeting norms and to utilize an equity lens in decision making. Everyone interested is welcome.



Oregon Home Visiting Systems coordination has been taking place at some level for many years including regional efforts through the Ford Family Foundation, prioritization of home visiting and creation of a sub-committee focused on home visiting by the Early Learning Council, and the establishment of the Center for Coordinating Oregon Home Visiting Systems (CCOHVS) in 2024.



The Home Visiting Action Network is **aligned** to the **Oregon Home Visiting Systems Theory of Action (TOA)**, which is aligned to the **Early Learning Council's Raise Up Oregon 2.0** and is being established with the **purpose of connection and implementation of the TOA strategies**.

For the purposes of the Home Visiting Action Network, home visiting includes prenatal to five option preventive home visiting services supporting children and families.

Family Leadership Group

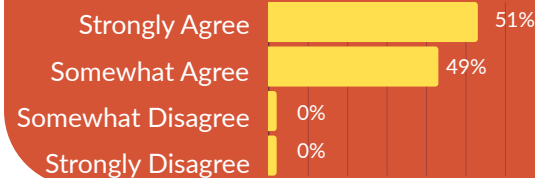
Some questions/suggestions that came up during the meeting:
